

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ -

As you probably know, travel to Haiti has been difficult this past year. My wife and I were hoping to make three different trips and were unable to make any trips. Things have settled a bit, but in the recent words of one of our Haitian pastor friends - "we are slowly climbing back into normalcy, but insecurity is rampant throughout the country.

Everywhere one may be, caution is the norm." Which is a good reminder that God remains in control...Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever...as baptized children of God we are in His hands.

I'm writing this at the end of January because God has opened another area of opportunity for my wife and I. We will be leaving for Shenzhen, China in a couple days to spend ten weeks serving two congregations there. We are well aware of the virus concerns and are tracking that through the CDC and our friends who are already serving there. We do ask your prayers for good health and safe travels back home in mid-April.

Writing early gives me the chance to look forward to the season of Lent. Please allow me a few thoughts.

Lent is a time of somber repentance. Repentance is contrition - true and deep sorrow for our sins, the realization that we come before a just and righteous God as beggars - and strong faith in trusting that Jesus' Lenten journey leads Him to the cross, where payment for all our sins was made. In Christ shedding His blood for the sins of the world, guilt and punishment for sin was removed. Gods favor and peace is ours because of the suffering and death of the One who suffered and died on our behalf, as our Substitute, in our place.

Odd to the world, and to us at times, that the cross is a place of victory. Jesus on the cross is battered, beaten, and bloody; "numbered with the transgressors". He will die there. But in doing so, sin, death, and the devil are defeated. That is His victory. That is our victory. And on Easter morning, the certainty and assurance of all that is (continued on page 6)


"On the shoulders of those who helped build the foundation"

Over the past few months we have lost some of our past and present board members who were foundational and dear to this organization.



Pastor Reimnitz was a founding member of the HLMS. He secured a large donation and loans to build the first Lutheran church in Haiti. He acted as president from 1978 - 2009. He, along with the other founders, developed the vision and over the years built and funded multiple churches, schools, orphanages and medical clinics to help the Haitian people. This organization would not be what it is today without the wise leadership of Pastor Reimnitz.

Jim Schmersal - (written by a fellow board member) Having been on many boards, you see people who are happy to offer up suggestions but then there are the rare ones who have the ideas and suggestions but are built for DOING. Jim Schmersal was a DOER! When it was time to retire it was like he made a decision that he was going to continue on at the same level but just change his focus to his passions which were his family, helping others and specifically the people of Haiti. He helped our Executive Director move several times, all in the same year. If you were working with him



you had to be ready to go because he was on a mission to get every job done concisely, efficiently and expeditiously. He wrote grant requests, he helped shuttle Pastor Thomas and his children who were going to University in NE, he took loads of donated items to Orphan Grain Train in Norfolk, he travelled to Haiti many times working on building projects at the orphanage and building playgrounds....the list could go on and on. To say that he was "all in" does not do justice to his passion to help. This was all done with absolutely no seeking or need for attention or accolades and with a quiet and reserved demeanor that was selfless. It was hard when he got sick to understand why someone like this could get cancer and suffer the way he did when he was so instrumental in the mission of the HLMS, telling people in Haiti about Jesus. The only answer could be that God has big plans for this man on the other side and needs more DOERS.

... Our Haitian friends found us a bus to use (Good Shepherd sold their bus)! Thank You Jesus!

... We had a team of 9, all of which had been to Haiti before! A smaller team has many benefits as you'll read below!

... With a smaller team we were able to go into Cite Soleil at the last minute to visit classrooms Sister Paesie has started for the street kids. What an eye opening exposure to some devastating conditions!

... Unexpected deep conversations during our morning and evening devotions because our group was smaller and more intimate.

... An unexpected Blessing was meeting Shelley Jean, the founder of the Apparent Project/Papillon, who employs 200 Haitians making jewelry from cereal boxes, clay pottery, selling T-shirts

making jewelry from cereal boxes, clay pottery, selling T-shirts and metal art! This was a highlight to meet the person behind the organization that helps so many Haitian families.

... Lavinski and Sara were unexpected Blessings/children that joined the orphanage/guesthouse where we stay. What a Joyful addition these kids were!

... 110 water filters were donated to us to bring down to help with clean drinking water!

- ... Being able to go to Rosie's home and meet her grandma! Jesus is all about relationships!
- ... We were all unexpectedly Blessed by one of our team members, Chad (a chef), who stepped in twice to cook our breakfasts in the mornings due to a death in Gertrude's family.

So many Unexpected Blessings were showered down on us! Thank You Lord for watching over us and surrounding us with Your Angels!! Thank You for letting us dispense about 200 free eye glasses to the Haitians, for letting us help one of our workers with his roof and another with a well, doing a craft, games,

and delivering food with those at House of Love and Hope, Divine Family and Hudsen's Youth program, and being able to spend precious time with Nadine and her family! Wow! Abundant Blessings all around!!! To God be the Glory in all these Blessings!!!

Jack Hunter - a former board member of the Haiti Lutheran Mission Society, was called to his eternal rest on February 9th after a brief battle with liver and pancreatic cancer. Jack was an invaluable help to the society and the work we support in Haiti. He possessed a degree in engineering that enabled him to be involved in, and sometimes supervise, the construction of major building projects like basketball arenas for the NBA, federal government buildings, theme parks like Universal Studio in Orlando, Florida, etc. It was his expertise in engineering matters along with his managerial and organizational talents that made him such a valuable asset to the work in Haiti. Even

more important, however, was his zeal for the gospel. Jack had a passion for sharing the message of Jesus and His love for all people, about His death and resurrection which gives all of us the sure and certain hope of eternal life. This is what compelled him to make 11 trips to Haiti, visiting and working on various projects, encouraging the laity and leaders of the Lutheran church there, and showing the love of Jesus to our Haitian friends. Jack and his wife, Pam, developed a long-lasting friendship with a little Haitian girl many years ago while working on the orphanage in Lilavois. It is a friendship and love that has continued for many years. She became like a daughter to Jack.

Jack and Pam were in Haiti when the 2010 earthquake struck. That night he and Pam, along with the rest of the mission team, stayed up all night, helping some of the victims of the quake as best they could. Two months later he and a fellow engineer returned to Haiti to assess the damage to the church's buildings and school. The day he left Haiti Pastor Louis dropped him off at the airport. Later that same day Pastor Louis was murdered outside his home. We will always be thankful that God sent Jack to work and help in Haiti. His contributions, not only on the engineering front, but his ability to recognize a problem and recommend a solution, will be greatly missed. We thank God repeatedly for his efforts and most of all for his love of our Lord and Savior, Jesus. Shortly before he died he was hospitalized for 13 days. Pastor Robert Nowak reports that Jack told him he witnessed to every one of the medical personnel that attended him. That was Jack, and we will miss him greatly. We thank God for him and eagerly look forward to seeing him again in heaven. Praise be to God!
