PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Listening to pastor friends in Haiti and watching the news of Haiti, I thought of the familiar passage from Hebrews 12 - "...let us run with endurance the race that is before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross...

Through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, Paul used the word "endure" twice in this short passage. The first is in relationship to the race we run called "life". It is not a sprint. It is a long distance race. It requires endurance, hanging in there. Although our lives are quite different than our Haitian brothers and sisters - one pastor told me it's never been worse in Haiti - we all to some extent deal with difficulties, hardships, and stress. They look differently, but they still impact our individual race.

The second use of endurance is in relationship to our Savior Jesus Christ. His life was about living, suffering, and dying on our behalf, for our sins. There was most certainly opposition, difficulties and hardships in the race Jesus ran. There was denial, betrayal, beatings, thorns, nails, thirst, forsakenness, death. He endured. He persisted. He hung, literally, in there. And the most remarkable thing of all - He did so with joy. He knew the end result of His race was the good results of our race - forgiveness, life, and salvation.

I pray daily for Haiti and our fellow believers there. I pray for the continued blessings that God bestows on the work of the Haiti Lutheran Mission Society. I thank God for faithful members of the HLMS who give so freely and generously to continue our work in Haiti. And I pray that although the race is extremely difficult now, that our Haitian brothers and sisters will run their race with endurance, fixing their eyes on Jesus. And may they realize they **do not run alone.**

Haiti - Current News Update!

We started to put this newsletter together and pulled in the articles before some major events happened in the country. We will give an update here but that is why some of the events weren't mentioned in the articles. **Assassination** – On July 7th, 2021 President Jovenel Moise was assassinated in his home by armed men.

There was uncertainty about who was in line to take over which led to chaos and political unrest in the country. **Earthquake** – On August 14th, 2021 – a magnitude 7.2 earthquake hit Haiti about 100 miles west of Portau-Prince close to Les Cayes. Over one million people were impacted by this including over half a million children. The schools, churches, and orphanage we support faired well but the aftershocks caused many to fear for their lives. The prices for everything from building materials to groceries and fuel have increased dramatically.

Hurricane – tropical storm Grace hit Haiti a few days after the earthquake. The wind and in some places over 10 inches of rain were miserable for the people who lost their homes and were living in the streets or tent cities.

Please pray for all our Haitian brothers and sisters during these unprecedented times and if you are able, please help us financially so we can continue to offer hope.

Letter from Pastor Thomas Bernard

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and our Lord Jesus Christ! We pray that all is well and continue to give thanks to the Almighty God who has sent His only Son Jesus to set us free from the bondage of evil that is trying to sink us into the ocean of despair. We are thankful to our God for His continuous blessings during this difficult time of crisis. Because of His love, grace, and mercy, we continue to shout "Ebenezer, Ebenezer"!

The biggest issue now is the current political unrest. It's challenging to travel from one place to another as safety challenges may arise unexpectedly. The pandemic and the social unrest are still raging among the Haitian people. The situation is getting more complex; in some places, some family members are obliged to leave their home in quest of another in a different neighborhood. Currently, traveling from Port-au-Prince to Leogane is difficult, if not impossible. Nobody knows what to expect and what to do.

Regardless of these circumstances, we remain hopeful. God is all-powerful and has the whole world in his hand. We know the plan He has for us: Jeremiah 29: 11: I know what I'm planning for you, says the Lord; I'm planning to make you happy and not to harm you, to give you a future you can hope for. So, no matter what will happen tomorrow, we are in God's hand. Because of his goodness and all his blessings, we will praise the Lord and sing to Him as long as we exist (Psalm 146:1). 

Kettia made reservations for us to get our Covid tests on Saturday morning so we would have the results back by Tuesday morning in time for our flight! It was



an all morning afair but we know where to go now and what to do if someone tests positive which Keith did as he had a light case of Covid 3 weeks before we left. It was very informative and we feel comfortable taking a team in this coming January, God willing, if the country stays calm.

Thank You always for your prayers and support when we are out of the country especially during these trying times! May God Bless all of our efforts as we try to be Jesus' Hands and Feet to His children in Haiti who are so distressed as they try and take care of themselves and their families.
