He was literally a giant of a man, head and shoulders above the shorter Israelites. He was armored to the hilt, a helmet of bronze and a coat of mail weighing over 100 pounds. His weaponry included a sword and

an immense spear whose iron point weighed over 100 pounds. Twice a day this giant of a man - Goliath by name - would enter the valley separating the Israeli and Philistine armies. Not only would he challenge Israel to provide someone to do battle with him, but he also spewed forth sarcastic and biting words of scorn for Israel's God. No wonder Saul hid in his tent. No wonder no one in the Israeli camp was willing to do battle with Goliath. It certainly meant a quick defeat and a gruesome death.

Into this dramatic scene steps the young shepherd boy, David. Hearing Goliath's daily tirade, David volunteered - "...your servant will go and fight him". Pastor Thomas' Update from Haiti

July 28,2022

Dear brothers, sisters and friends in Christ,

Grace and Peace to you from God our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! We pray that all is well as we are serving the Almighty One.

Unfortunately, we are writing you this update today without very much contentment or joy, as again the hardships seem to be amassing atop another. The main issues we face today in the country as individuals and even as a congregation have to do with security, the high levels of inflation, and still to this day political instability. There has been an increase in crimes, such as: kidnappings, assassination attempts, and theft of property. Furthermore, with gangs controlling a few parts of the country, economic activity has vastly slowed down and in some areas reached a standstill with families looking for shelter in safer areas leaving everything behind. The authorities have stated that there are roughly 15 kidnappings that happen every week on the national territory. Due to this fact, our currency continues to be devalued against the dollar and increasing the cost of living for many. The situation is very tough to be frank. Right now, we are doing our best to prepare for the upcoming school year which should begin in September, with the hope that we see some sort of relief in both the security and economic situation. We simply cannot allow the kids that need an education to be left helpless. We have ended the academic school year (2021-2022) with 475 kids, and this year (2022-2023) we are expecting 515 based on current registration.

Nonetheless, we know that our God is faithful and his love for us endures forever. He has provided for us and will continue to do, just as he feeds the birds and various other creatures in nature. Most of the time we complain about what we do not have and what we don't receive from God, forgetting all that we have received from Him and what he has done. We must continue to put our Faith in Him and let His Will be done. We keep each one of you and the whole world in our prayers; especially at this time when the wars, inflation, and illness are touching each and every one of us globally.

We thank God for His protection and guidance. He continues to bless the ministry of the Good

Shepherd Evangelical Lutheran Church & School. We also want to take this opportunity to thank each one of you and the various congregations for your continuous support and most importantly your continuous prayers. May our Heavenly Father continue to keep us safe, give us hope and keep us in his Grace.
